

Church Unbound NEW YEAR "Kick-off"

In 2025 we look to continue to develop St. Mark's ministry with *Church Unbound*. Our second weekend commitment begins Saturday and Sunday, **January 11 & 12**. On Saturday we gather in the kitchen at 11 a.m. to make sandwiches and fill paper bags with three food items. The first two are tangerines and a small bag of chips. What has been the third item? Read on!

Up until now the third item had been a Rice Crispy Treat. But we want to offer something

fresher and homemade. And we want to offer some members of St. Mark's another way to participate in this ministry by baking a couple dozen cookies and packaging 3-4 in a Ziplock bag. These cookies will now be the third item in the bag to go with sandwiches. You can bring your cookies and put them in a box so marked at the church entrance anytime by Saturday morning, January 11 th when we pack the lunches. 


