St. Mark's will hold a parish-wide meeting during adult-education time to introduce the capital campaign Feasibility Study process, the next step towards our building renewal. The feasibility phase is an opportunity to hear directly from you as we discern the willingness of our members to support a capital campaign.

Some of us will be interviewed by the consultants. Those with a consistent giving or pledging history will receive a survey. Feasibility surveys and a case statement outlining the project will be hitting our mailboxes/inboxes in early March, 2025.

ABQ FaithWorks and Indivisible Albuquerque.


