Feasibility Study surveys will be mailed to many those St. Mark's households with a giving history on March 3, 2025. Included will be a case statement for our proposed capital campaign.

This will be an opportunity to hear directly from our community as we discern the willingness of our members to support a capital campaign. You can respond to the surveys either on paper or electronically. Completed surveys are to be returned to the consultants by March 30, 2025. Please take the time to read, pray, and respond to this invitation for input.

If you have questions about the Feasibility Study, please be sure to attend the parish-wide meeting on February 23, 2025, during adult-education time, at 11:15 AM in the Parish Hall.

Again, we hope you will find resonance with a vision for a building that is even more welcoming, useful, and supportive of our primary mission as followers of Jesus, to be about reconciliation with God and our neighbors, within ourselves, our faith community, and in the city and world in which we live. Being stewards of all our resources, including the building we know and love and out of which all our ministries are launched, is a vital part of our life together as a church. We are eager to discern how each of us can participate in this work.

St. Mark's New Book Group


Saturday, March 22, 2025 10:00 AM

Luis's natural gift for conversation was evident from a young age. He fondly recalls his elementary school teachers saying, "Luis, you sure love to talk." Reflecting on his school days, Luis shares, "I was kind of the teacher's pet, I guess. I loved to participate. I liked school."

Raised in Roswell, New Mexico, Luis grew up in a close-knit Mexican-American family. His upbringing was steeped in the traditions of their faith, and the church played a significant role in his childhood. Luis actively participated in his local parish and attended catechism classes until the eighth grade. However, his journey with the church took a difficult turn when he came out as gay and led him to drift away from the church for several years. Read the article.

Join us for spiritual sharing and exploration on Thursdays following the Eucharist. Drop-ins are welcome. You're not required to read the





Living Stories in Lent

March 12 thru April 9, 2025

St. Mark's has been invited to be part of a pilot project in which we can help experience, explore, and shape Living Stories.

Living Stories is an emerging approach to preaching that turns the traditional sermon into a shared, interactive experience for all generations. Living Stories seeks to bring the Gospel to life with tactile storytelling, wondering questions, and a spirit of

authentic communion. Through this innovative model, rooted in the traditions of the Church and inspired by methods like <u>Godly Play</u>, participants co-create the sermon by engaging with Scripture and each other. The result? A deeper spiritual connection and a space where every voice helps tell the sacred story.

We are looking for participants from every generation—including young children, elders, and everyone in between—to be part of St. Mark's "Living Stories in Lent" Cohort.

Registrants should be able to commit to attending at least 3 of our 5 Living Stories Sessions, which will be held from 5:30-6pm in Stoney Chapel each Wednesday during Lent (March 12th, 19th, 26th, April 2nd, and 9th). Participants are encouraged to join other members of St. Mark's for a Lenten Soup Supper in the parish hall immediately following each session.


WORSHIP CORNER
