





Living Stories in Lent

Join Us For Films, Fellowship, Discussion, Songs, Scripture Stories, Reflection, and Prayers for ALL Ages

St. Mark's has been invited to be part of a pilot project in which we can help experience, explore, and shape <u>Living Stories</u>.

Living Stories is an emerging approach to preaching that turns the traditional sermon into a shared, interactive experience for all generations. Living Stories seeks to bring the Gospel to life with tactile storytelling, wondering questions, and a spirit of authentic communion. Through this innovative model, rooted in the traditions of the Church and inspired by methods like Godly Play, participants co-create the sermon by engaging with Scripture and each other. The result? A deeper spiritual connection and a space where every voice helps tell the sacred story.

We are looking for participants from every generation—including young children, elders, and everyone in between—to be part of St. Mark's "Living Stories in Lent" Cohort.

Registrants should be able to commit to attending at least 3 of our 5 Living Stories Sessions, which will be held from 5:30-6pm in Stoney Chapel each Wednesday during Lent (March 12th, 19th, 26th, April 2nd, and 9th). Participants are encouraged to join other members of St. Mark's for a Lenten Soup Supper in the parish hall immediately following each session.

Lenten Passion Play Working Group


For the past 6 years, St. Mark's Palm Sunday Liturgy has featured an intergenerational Passion Play, in which members of St. Mark's have embodied the homily for the day in the

form of a dramatic enactment of the appointed Passion Gospel. This year we are inviting anyone who is interested in helping imagine, create, direct and/or perform in the Palm Sunday Passion Play to be part of our Passion Play Working Group. Readers, Writers, Actors, Dancers, Composers, Musicians, Artists, and Performers of All Sorts, Ages, and Abilities are needed!

The Passion Plan Working Group will meet beginning March 9th in Classroom #3 (behind the kitchen) every Sunday in Lent during our "Education Hour" (11:15am-12:15pm) to dream, plan, and prepare together. We will have one final "dress rehearsal" in the Nave on Sunday, April 6th for those members, including children and youth, who are interested in performing in the Passion Play, but are not interested/available to participate in planning. The Passion Play will be offered during the Palm Sunday Liturgy on Sunday, April 13th. If you are interested in participating, please contact Mother Sylvia.

Preparing for Holy Baptism - Great Vigil of Easter

In the course of our life-long spiritual journey, there are various doorways of invitation into deeper commitment. Baptism is the doorway into full participation in the universal life and family of the Church. In the Sacrament of Baptism we are incorporated as full members



of the Body of Christ. People may be initiated into Christ's Body through the Sacrament of Baptism at any age or stage in life. Baptism may be celebrated at any time, but is traditionally reserved for one of four baptismal feast days: Easter (March/April), Pentecost (May/June), All Saints (November), and Baptism of our Lord (January).

The Great Vigil of Easter is the primary occasion when, from the earliest days of the Church, new members were welcomed into the fellowship of the Church through Baptism, and it remains the primary occasion for baptism, especially for older children and adults.

In 2025 the Great Vigil of Easter begins on Saturday, April 19th at 8 pm , and the liturgy is followed by a Feast and Dance Party (in other words, plan to take a long nap that day in preparation for a BIG CELEBRATION!).

During our Ash Wednesday service, we hear these words: "Dear People of God: The first Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church to prepare for them by a season of penitence and fasting. This season of Lent provided. a time in which converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism." (Book of Common Prayer, p. 264-265).

It has become our custom at St. Mark's to formally mark the entrance of those who wish to be baptized at the Great Vigil of Easter into this season of preparation with special prayers during the Sunday liturgies during Lent, beginning the first Sunday of Lent (In 2025 that's Sunday, March 9th.)



March 6: Preaching Reflection Group

Join this seasonal gathering for Thursday sermon preachers AND Thursday sermon listeners to reflect together on the art of preaching, what "works" for each of us, and how the practice of sermon preparation, sermon delivery, and sermon listening is helping each of us grow in faith.

March 13 to 4/10: Book Study Grounded: Finding God in the World, A Spiritual Revolution by Diana Butler Bass

The headlines are clear: religion is on the decline in America as many people leave behind traditional religious practices. Diana Butler Bass, leading commentator on religion, politics, and culture, follows up her acclaimed book Christianity After Religion by arguing that what appears to be a decline actually signals a major transformation in how people understand and experience God. The distant God of conventional religion has given way to a more intimate sense of the sacred that is with us in the world. This shift, from a vertical understanding of God to a God found on the horizons of nature and human community, is at the heart of a spiritual revolution that surrounds us — and that is challenging not only religious institutions but political and social ones as well.



<u>Grounded</u> explores this cultural turn as Bass unpacks how people are finding new spiritual ground by discovering and embracing God everywhere in the world around us—in the soil, the

water, the sky, in our homes and neighborhoods, and in the global commons. Faith is no longer a matter of mountaintop experience or institutional practice; instead, people are connecting with God through the environment in which we live. Grounded guides readers through our contemporary spiritual habitat as it points out and pays attention to the ways in which people experience a God who animates creation and community.

Bass brings her understanding of the latest research and studies and her deep knowledge of history and theology to Grounded. She cites news, trends, data, and pop culture, weaves in spiritual texts and ancient traditions, and pulls it all together through stories of her own and others' spiritual journeys. Grounded observes and reports a radical change in the way many people understand God and how they practice faith. In doing so, Bass invites readers to join this emerging spiritual revolution, find a revitalized expression of faith, and change the world.

HB 9 Immigrant Safety Act Toolkit

There's so much that we can't do anything about right now, here's



something we CAN do! The NM Immigrant Law Center has put together a resource for taking action during this difficult political climate. **EVERYTHING you need is in the toolkit below!**

Contact your legislators about House Bill 9, the Immigrant Safety Act (formerly Dignity Not Detention). If passed, the act will **prevent NM**Counties from contracting with ICE to use private prison, which have poor safety records, to detain migrants in NM.

At the link button below, you will find more information and sample language for calling or emailing representatives. The Legislature is now in session. The bill has passed one committee and needs every vote when it gets to the floor.


